



What To Bring

These are some of the types of work you may be doing:

1. Tear out, demolition, and salvage clean up
2. Paint interior and exterior
3. Drywall hanging and finishing
4. Simple masonry repair
5. Insulating
6. Aluminum and vinyl siding
7. Single story roofing
8. Window and door repair (limited)
9. Repair porches and install handicap ramps
10. Install mobile home skirting
11. Brush and debris removal / landscaping

Things to bring:

Please label everything. Each person should pack the following:

- ◆ Sturdy work boots¹
- ◆ Hat
- ◆ Utility knife
- ◆ Safety glasses
- ◆ Flashlight
- ◆ Bug repellent
- ◆ Sun screen
- ◆ Bible, pencil and notepad
- ◆ Towel, washcloth and soap
- ◆ Toiletries like shampoo, toothbrush and toothpaste
- ◆ Sleeping bag and pillow
- ◆ Air mattress or cot (no queen or king size for one person!)
- ◆ Shower shoes/sandals/flip flops
- ◆ Work clothes (at least one pair of long pants and one long sleeve shirt)
- ◆ swim suit (females, please one piece or a tankini)
- ◆ rain parka or something to wear in case of rain
- ◆ extra sets of clothing/shoes for messy work or to look more clean in the evenings
- ◆ Work gloves
- ◆ Hammer – 16 oz
- ◆ Dust mask
- ◆ Paint brush
- ◆ 6 in 1 Screwdriver set (if possible)
- ◆ Two work pencils
- ◆ Tape measure – 25 ft
- ◆ Canvas tool belt – cheap kind, ties in back
- ◆ Small tool bag for all personally labeled tools

¹ This item is very important for EVERYONE to have because they provide the feet with more protection (sturdy work boots have a thicker sole which prevents a nail from going through the shoe into a person's foot) and they provide support to a person's ankles.
