Christian Endeavor Statement of Faith and Leadership Contract

To ensure that all people representing the ministry of Christian Endeavor espouse the same values, all persons in leadership roles at Summer Assembly must sign/initial each aspect of our ministry's statement of faith.

- _____ We believe the Bible is verbally inspired of God and inerrant in the original writings. The Bible is the infallible Word of God, that it is God's Holy and inspired Word, both Old and New Testament, and is the supreme and final authority for matters of Christian faith and conduct.

John 17:17; Galatians 3:16; 2 Timothy 3:16–17; 2 Peter 1:19–21

- _____ We believe there is one true God, who is infinite, perfectly holy, and eternal, existing in three persons: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, each having precisely the same nature, attributes, and perfections.

Matthew 28:19–20; John 1:1–2; Acts 5:3–4; Colossians 2:9

- _____ We believe that the Lord Jesus Christ is fully God and fully man. He was eternally brought about by the Father, conceived by the Holy Spirit, and born of the Virgin Mary. We believe that Jesus Christ died for the sins of the whole world as the substitution for the death we should have died, and that his crucified body was raised from the dead, and that he ascended into heaven to appear before the Father as our high priest, advocate, and mediator.

In this age, the Holy Spirit carries out the ministries of restraining evil in the world; convicting people of sin, righteousness, and judgment; regenerating and indwelling all believers; baptizing them into the Body of Christ; sealing them unto the day of redemption; and empowering them for sanctification and service.

- _____ We believe God created male and female in his image and that when Adam succumbed to the temptation of Satan and chose to disobey God, sin and its curse

was brought upon the human race. Since the penalty of sin is death, as long as people live in sin, we are dead spiritually and face a physical death and eternal punishment in hell. This fall from grace put man in the position of needing forgiveness in order that our fellowship with God might be restored. All human beings, with the exception of Christ Jesus, are born with a sin nature, are accountable for their sin, and need to be born again.

He becomes a new creation, a member of the true Church, indwelt by the Holy Spirit. This salvation is not the result of any human effort or works, but is the free gift of God's grace in Jesus Christ, once for all, forever.

Christian Endeavor Event Gender Inclusion Policy

(Adopted: October 12, 2021/Christian Endeavor - USA)

Christian Endeavor - USA (CE) desires to clearly communicate its position based upon its sincerely held religious beliefs. These beliefs are mandated by God's Word which teaches the distinctiveness, complementariness, and immutability of the male sex and female sex. See Genesis 2 and Matthew 19:4. God's Word also teaches us to have a loving attitude toward all people, Matthew 22:37-40. CE wants all people to feel accepted as people wonderfully created by God as the ministry teaches it's clearly held scriptural positions on Creation, Redemption, Salvation and Faith.

Locker Room, Restroom, Changing Room, and Shower use policy:

- Sex specific locker room, restroom, changing room, and shower facilities may only be utilized consistent with the sex assigned at birth and not gender identity or expression. Optional family (non-sex specific) restrooms may also be made available to a youth(s) upon availability at the camp, church or facilities where an event is being hosted.

Small Group policy:

- Many Christian Endeavor events choose to use small groups to deepen discussion and further learning while also nurturing relationships. Depending upon the setting and topic, gender specific small groups may be used. Youth are asked to participate in small groups consistent with the sex assigned at birth and not by gender identity or expression. Individual discussion times can be provided depending upon staff availability and the interest of the participating youth.

Inclusion:

- All young people wrestle with identity issues. Regardless of how these issues manifest themselves, Christian Endeavor desires every youth to feel loved and cared for. CE takes significant steps to provide an environment where young people experience a sense of belonging. Therefore, bullying other youth because of their gender, ethnicity, socio-economic status or any other personal choice or characteristic will not be tolerated.

Youth choosing to disregard the above stated requirements, after being guided toward following the policy, will be asked to leave the CE event. This departure will take place at the expense of the youth or youth caregivers which may include traveling to the event facility to collect the youth and the youth's belongings.

This policy will be made available by distribution to church youth ministry leadership in advance of Christian Endeavor events. Adult leaders will also be reminded of this policy at the beginning of CE events.

Christian Endeavor Teen Guidelines

During your time serving the teens at Summer Assembly, you will be an important and influential role model—most of their time will be spent with you! The campers will look up to you and emulate your actions. Therefore, please read the following guidelines that teens must follow during their week at Summer Assembly and acknowledge that you will also follow and encourage these guidelines during the week, in order to effectively demonstrate the love of Christ and your desire to guide these young people in the right way.

1. Please follow all Summer Assembly safety instructions and schedule.
2. Please leave all video games, radios, iPods, etc. at home. Take this time to connect face to face.
3. Please leave phones in rooms during all activities and use only a printed Bible during evening sessions, quiet time, Bible Studies, etc. If you do not have a print Bible, ones will be made available.
4. All medicines taken by youth must be taken under youth leader supervision.
5. Stick to all time schedules, especially for mealtimes, evening program, and lights out. Mealtime is especially important since there are other camps sharing the dining hall.
6. Be respectful of the camp property. We would like to leave the camp the same, if not better, than it was prior to our use of the facilities.
7. Quiet Hours: Rules from Refreshing Mountain: “We are requiring each group to list this rule on their schedule. This encourages a general respect between groups for each other, and also helps to avoid any annoying noise issues. All of the OUTDOOR grounds must be quiet and still at 11PM. You are welcome to be up past this time as long as everyone is INSIDE a building, but all OUTSIDE transfers past 11PM must be kept quiet. By Midnight, everyone needs to go to their lodging areas and go to bed. Please inform all of your helpers/counselors/adults of this rule, because they will be the ones that make sure it gets enforced.”
8. Dress respectfully. We ask that no bra straps or boxers are to be shown, no spaghetti straps. Cleavage cannot be shown at any time, no bare shoulders for tops or dresses at any time. No short-shorts or mini-miniskirts. Swimsuits should be full suit or we ask you wear a dark t-shirt over it.
9. Please treat others in a spirit of Romans 12: 9-13 – Love must be sincere. Hate what is evil; cling to what is good. Be devoted to one another in love. Honor one another above yourselves. Never be lacking in zeal, but keep your spiritual fervor, serving the Lord. Be joyful in hope, patient in affliction, and faithful in prayer. Share with the Lord’s people who are in need. Practice hospitality.
10. Avoid intimate contact with others.
11. Respect the name of the Jesus. (“Oh my God” is not acceptable.) Other inappropriate words will not be acceptable either.
12. Stay away from rooms lived in by the opposite gender.
13. Have a great time!
